Science/SS

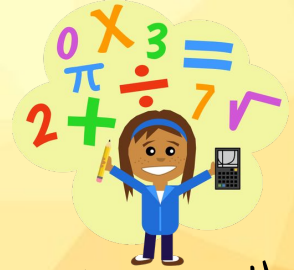
We have a lot of exciting things we will be learning about this year in science and social studies!

Science Units:

- How do objects affect the motion of other objects?
- What causes the difference between organisms?
- What affects organisms' survival?
- How does the climate affect organisms?

Social Studies Units:

MATH

In math, we will have Missouri Learning Standard aligned units. Throughout the school year, students will be learning multi-digit addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. We will also focus on multi-step word problems. One of the greatest focuses for 3rd grade math is becoming fluent in multiplication and division.

This year we will be using a new math resource called Into Math.



READING/WRITING



We will follow the Reader's workshop model of mini lesson, independent read time, and share time. Students will read from a wide range of genres in both fiction and nonfiction while learning to analyze and evaluate text to create lifelong learners!

Students will be writing a variety of texts this year. Our main focus will be narrative, opinion, informational text, and research. Through writing, we will focus on researching a topic, citing text, and using technology to produce a published piece of work.

COMMUNICATION

Primary communication will come through Seesaw, our building wide communication platform. Please regularly check your sis–connected email as some communication will come through that platform.

***If we go virtual at any point, all classroom information and communication will come through Seesaw. We will use the Google Platform for assignments.
